PraeVeni SBC was incorporated as a MN Specific Benefit Corporation on March 18, 2016. During 2016, PraeVeni opened a youth heart screening center at 6565 City West Parkway, Eden Prairie, MN 55344. The center works with community organizations, schools, athletic associations, and expert Cardiologists to prevent sudden cardiac death (SCD) in young athletes and non-athletes ages 5 − 20 years of age. PraeVeni administers a state-of-the-art Focused Echocardiographic Screening Test (FEST)™ for young participants that affirms the NORMAL state of heart features known to be associated with SCD and which don't show up during regular checkups or sport physicals.

A Social Imperative

The incidence of Sudden Cardiac Death (SCD) have <u>not</u> declined over the past 20 years and its time for a new approach to prevention. Consider the following:

- · Heart abnormalities often have NO symptoms
- 3 in every 100 kids have an undiagnosed heart condition
- Sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) is the #1 killer of student athletes
- The #2 cause of death for youth under age 25 is SCA

SCD happens without warning and is often diagnosed <u>after</u> it occurs. Seemingly healthy kids rarely have preventative heart checks due to the lack of symptoms and the ineffectiveness and high costs of common **diagnostic testing** (ECG, diagnostic echo, stress test, CT Scan, MRI) used as a <u>screening</u> tool. Waiting to <u>diagnose</u> and treat a warning sign is not effective in preventing tragic cardiac events in our children.

More than 200,000 K12 students live within a 20-mile radius of the PraeVeni screening center... an estimated 6,000 of them have an undiagnosed heart condition. PraeVeni provides the community an affordable heart screening solution to prevent SCA and SCA.

Finding Emerging Risk Features to Prevent SCD

During 2016, PraeVeni leased, improved and opened the screening center, developed and launched a custom digital registration and workflow system, and began to partner within the community to screen the maximum number of participants ages 5 - 20.

PraeVeni administers a state-of-the-art Focused Echocardiographic Screening Test (FEST)™, which provides early detection of heart conditions in symptom-free people. Risk features associated with

SCD have various structural, functional, hemodynamic, angiographic and electrical features... an **echocardiogram** (ultrasound of the heart) is <u>uniquely</u> capable of **seeing inside the body**, using sound waves to create images and to evaluate these various feature types.

PraeVeni's FEST™ includes a Risk Assessment Questionnaire, blood pressure check, and an echocardiogram designed to unequivocally affirm heart and blood vessel features are **NORMAL** and rule-out **ABNORMAL** features.

2016 Results

A common diagnostic echocardiogram exam will cost families >\$1,000. PraeVeni administers the FEST™ for \$99 and often discounts the price to ensure affordability and accessibility within the community.

During Q4 2016, PraeVeni administered 228 screenings at an average participant cost of \$73. PraeVeni identified 5 (2%) young participants with previously undiagnosed congenital heart conditions and referred them to their physicians for further diagnosis. The screening had a positive impact on these young participants and their families and averted possible tragic cardiac events within the community.
