

Narrative Description:

- individuals by providing free or affordable consulting, Professional guidance, and development and leadership both personally and professionally. In the many years of consulting, we have encountered countless business that are in such bad shape that they are unable to afford to pay for consulting help and do not have any or know of any other free resources. In 2018 we were able to raise nearly \$10,000 to help those in need. With those funds, we were able to help 8 businesses in need as well as 2 individuals for a total of 10 helped. We consider this a tremendous success considering that we only operated from July- December.
- ii. We helped three local businesses in the Twin Cities area that could not otherwise afford to get the help they needed in their business. We also where able to help 2 international clients in Canada and 3 others in the state of Florida. In addition to the helping those businesses in need, Devoted Foundations SBC was also able to afford to pay for two lunch and learn sessions to help business owners in October and November with the help of the Small Business Advisory Board of MN. Lastly, we were able to help two individuals that desired to improve their business life. They both lacked education needed to write their own business plan and launch their business from their unemployed status. We helped them launch their business and do it from a solid foundation platform.
- iii. The only thing that hindered us from helping more individuals and businesses was the difficulty in raising funds. Most funds came from former clients of the owner, Vernon Stading and we hope to expand on that in 2019.
