

 - B Impact Assessment, which is provided by B-Lab, 15 Waterloo Ave., Berwyn, PA 19312
 - (ii) With reference to that third-party standard:
 - (A) The corporation has pursued general public benefit in the following ways:
 - providing programming and consulting services to individuals involved in the criminal justice system, at the pre- and post-sentencing stages, as well as post-release from incarceration, in an effort to reduce recidivism among the criminal offender populations; and
 - offering one-on-one personal coaching as well as group cognitive behavior therapy designed to alter the manner in which criminal offenders think and behave.
 - (B) The extent to which and the ways in which the corporation has created general public benefit include:
 - education on these topics has been provided to the community, to potential clients and to their attorneys; and
 - evidentiary measurements confirm the success of our programming content in reducing recidivism.
