Background on HumanitarianHR

HumanitarianHR was established as a Specific Benefit Corporation (SBC) on May 24, 2018 to prevent and protect vulnerable people from sexual exploitation, abuse, and trafficking.

In tandem with the global movement to end impunity for sexual harassment and exploitation, HumanitarianHR was launched to eradicate the sexual exploitation, abuse, and trafficking of refugees and displaced people by those working in the development and humanitarian sector. HumanitarianHR has a diverse team of consultants helping organizations develop the highest standards to protect affected populations from sexual exploitation and abuse, safeguarding dignity and restoring hope for those silenced in global development and aid settings.

HumanitarianHR services provided include:

- Safeguarding policy and practice recommendations
- Independent safeguarding investigations and recommendations
- Development of safeguarding investigation procedures
- Protection from sexual harassment, exploitation, and abuse (PSHEA) training for staff and managers
- Training for safeguarding investigators and focal points

- Development of prevention, response, and accountability mechanisms, including community-based complaint mechanisms
- PSEAH prevention mainstreaming
- Auditing of safeguarding programs
- PSEAH accountability and compliance guidance for contractors and vendors
- Ombudsman support for survivors
- Protective accompaniment for vulnerable people

HumanitarianHR focuses exclusively on helping organizations bolster their safeguarding work to protect the people they serve from sexual exploitation, abuse, harassment, and human trafficking by humanitarian actors.

In 2021, HumanitarianHR, SBC continued to provide all of its services through online and remote support because of the restrictions imposed on travel due to the global pandemic. The following services were provided in 2021, in conformance with HumanitarianHR's mission as a specific benefit corporation:

• Conducted remote independent investigations into allegations of sexual exploitation, abuse, and harassment by aid workers against humanitarian aid recipients in Kenya,

Uganda, Liberia, Guinea, Sierra Leone, South Sudan, Nigeria, Haiti, Peru, Nicaragua, Malawi, Madagascar, and Afghanistan.

 Conducted remote safeguarding training for humanitarian and development aid staff working in Africa, Latin American, and the Middle East.

- Completed a three year consultancy with the World Bank with the development of training
 on receiving and handling allegations of sexual exploitation, abuse and harassment.
 Comprehensive training modules with facilitator manuals were developed in French and
 English.
- Completed a training package for facilitators to teach prevention and response to sexual
 exploitation and abuse for an international NGO membership organization. The training
 materials will be accessible online to humanitarian aid and development organizations
 throughout the world.
- Conducted a sexual exploitation, abuse, and harassment safeguarding survey and assessment for a major international aid organization headquartered in Rome, Italy, with 250 partners worldwide.
- Conducted a safeguarding assessment of a major British NGO for a European Foundation that was providing funding for the NGO in Cambodia.
- Conducted a safeguarding assessment for an Australian NGO for one of its partners in Nepal.
- Secured a monthly retainer agreement to provide safeguarding and investigation services for a major US NGO with global operations.
- Secured a two year contract with UNICEF to provide safeguarding investigation training to its staff and partners worldwide.
- · Hired new consultants located in Nicaragua, Malawi, and Nepal

Nothing hindered HumanitarianHR, SBC's efforts to pursue or create its specific public benefit. We were able to successfully move to online and remote support for our clients in response to travel and other restrictions imposed by the global pandemic.
