Annual Benefit Report for Local Blasts GBC for calendar Year 2021

The Board of Directors of Local Blasts GBC (the "Company") in 2021 again chose and adopted BCorp as our third-party standard and we have determined BCorp to be independent. Our third-party standard is being applied in a manner consistent with its application in prior years.

During calendar year 2021 the Company continued development of our patented hardware and software technology for our innovative Sweepstakes Wheel platform, and we also tested our proprietary online platform Zoom Sweepstakes extending live streamed drawing.

In 2021 the Companies wholly owned subsidiary, Over The Top Sweepstakes, formalized a relationship with Creative Charitable Fundraising Inc., a Florida nonprofit, and we have commenced targeted marketing activities toward both commercial and charitable organizations.

Due to the lingering effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, we had to postpone our sweepstakes activities which were planned take place in the Minneapolis Skyway system; we plan to initiate sweepstakes events in such Skyway system the spring of 2022.

Our proprietary sweepstakes system has been designed and developed for both commercial and charitable uses, with our charitable clients receiving a material percentage of all donations obtained through use of our platform. Our targeted demographic beneficiaries/clients include both commercial business and charitable organizations of all types and sizes.

We believe the BCorp standard we are using is the most cost-effective and appropriate for the Company. Our system was designed to influence and foster the charitable donations sector by eliminating fraud and misuse in charitable sweepstakes transactions. The Company also believes using our innovative transparent sweepstakes wheel platform will increase charitable donations to our charity organization clients due to its exciting influence on donors and others.

As a small start-up corporation with no full-time employees, it is difficult for the Company to satisfy or improve some of the metrics outlined in our assessment standard, but we will continually address such challenges in the future.
