Green New Deal Homes SBC, a Minnesota Public Benefit Corporation 21 March 2022

This report covers activities from January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021.

The corporation undertook significant activities in 2021 to support its public benefit purpose.

We sold licenses for three home designs to the nonprofit organization Green New Deal Housing, at the affordable price of \$650.00 per license. Each license provides the full architectural drawing set and specifications to be used for the construction of one home. We offered technical support services to Green New Deal Housing to assist the preparation to build their first zero net energy home project, to be sold to an income-qualifying household.

We also contracted with Green New Deal Housing to develop and deliver their Pilot Curriculum and Workforce Training program, a workforce development project aimed at building a green-collar construction workforce in Duluth. We developed a four-part introductory course called Laying the Groundwork for Sustainable Housing, 8 hours of instruction for students, tradespeople, trainees and professionals who are interested or invested in green building. We delivered the course for the first time to continuing education students at Fond du Lac Tribal and Community College. Green New Deal Homes SBC retains ownership of the intellectual property of this coursework, but has granted Green New Deal Housing non-exclusive rights to use the curriculum material in perpetuity to further their mission of developing equitable zero energy housing and green collar workforce in the Arrowhead region.

In August, 2021 Green New Deal Housing SBC changes its name to Green New Deal Homes SBC, and submitted Amended Articles of Incorporation to the State of Minnesota. The specific public benefit of the corporation remains the same: to design and build affordable zero-net carbon homes to have a scalable impact on climate change and household income stability.

We partnered with the University of Minnesota Duluth Office of Sustainability to develop a research project called "How Much and How Much Better?" The project is funded in part by the Univ of MN Institute on the Environment, and is co-led by Green New Deal Homes President Rachel Wagner and UMD Sustainability Manager Jonna Korpi. Additional support comes from the nonprofit MN Center for Energy and the Environment and industry partner Auer Steel. Working with three student interns, we are analyzing the costs of construction and long-term operation and ownership of two version of the same GNDH SBC-designed house if built in Duluth: the Evergreen zero net energy house (as designed) vs the Evergreen house if built just to current Minnesota energy code standards. The goal is to assist the general public and people in the housing industry (realtors, appraisers, and builders) to understand and appropriately value the benefits of zero net energy building. The project will be completed in summer 2022, and materials will be presented publicly and posted online.
