RE: Annual Benefit Report of Research and Development Laboratories General Benefit Corporation

Our company pursued general public benefit with reference to independent third-party standard, Impact Assessment, by identifying and researching global problems and solutions for sustainable development as well as how to maximize net-positive impact. B-Lab's Impact Assessment is being applied in a manner consistent with the application in prior reports.

Activities that correlate directly with B-Lab's Impact Assessment include:

- reducing our carbon footprint by using an all-electric vehicle for our operations
- improving the sustainability of our policies and procedures
- improving the safety and health of our facilities, like improving and monitoring air quality

The main circumstance that hindered efforts to pursue or create general and specific public benefits was limited financial resources.

Regarding specific public benefits, we:

- doubled our facility's lease to design, engineer, and fabricate scientifically staged, pre-prototype experiments involving mechanical and structural systems for public benefit.
- researched businesses and facilities to acquire, which would accelerate our impact.
- continued to research open-source hardware licenses, which may allow us to continuously publish and provide access to results obtained and methods used to derive data.
- are researching and developing ways to increase the energy and resource efficiencies of imperfect mechanical and structural systems in use today:
 - chassis for aerodynamically-efficient vehicles
 - energy efficient air handling technology
 - vertical agriculture system
 - polyhedral structural systems
 - robotics
 - computing systems
