National Voter Registration Day

Leverage National Voter Registration Day (September 16, 2025) to engage your community—neighbors, colleagues, employees, and more—in the voting process. Plan and distribute your communications by September 15 to maximize impact and encourage participation.

September 16th is National Voter Registration Day—let's get ready to vote! The first step is to confirm your voter registration. If you've never voted in Minnesota, recently moved, changed your name, or haven't voted in the past four years, now is the time to register.

But that's just the beginning. Did you know you can <u>vote early in person</u>? If you're planning to be out of town on Election Day (November 4th) or prefer to <u>vote by mail</u>, apply for an absentee ballot today. No matter how you vote, make sure your voice is heard. Contact your <u>local</u> jurisdiction to request an absentee ballot.

And don't forget—16- and 17-year-olds can <u>pre-register</u> to vote, so they're ready when the time comes!

National Voter Registration Day

Tuesday, September 16th is National Voter Registration Day. Are you prepared to vote in the upcoming local elections?

First step: <u>Check your registration</u>. If you've never voted in Minnesota, have recently moved, have recently changed your name or haven't voted in more than four years, you will need to <u>register to</u> vote.

Second step: Register, if necessary. It takes just a few minutes and can be done on your phone, tablet computer, or on paper. Although you can register at the polls on Election Day in Minnesota, avoid the lines and save time by doing it now.

Third step: Check out your ballot and start thinking about your votes.

There are local elections all across Minnesota this year. Local elections are critical in determining essential services, like public safety, education, transportation, and sanitation. Don't miss your chance to participate!

Local elections often have lower turnout compared to statewide or national elections. This means your vote goes even further and can significantly influence the outcome of the election. Your vote matters.



ADDITIONAL VOTING TOPICS

Voter Registration: If you are new to Minnesota, have recently moved within Minnesota, haven't voted in more than 4 years, or will be voting for the first time, you will need to register before you vote. You can register on Election Day, but it will save you time if you complete your registration before October 14, 2025.

- Online registration
- Print a registration form and return by mail
- If you plan on registering on Election Day, be prepared!
- 16- and 17-year-olds can pre-register to vote
- You can vote with a criminal record, as long as you are not currently incarcerated

Military personnel and their families if stationed away from home:

- Order your absentee ballot now
- Return your absentee ballot by these suggested dates

Need to Vote Absentee? Here's how.

- Working out of state or won't be home:
 - In-person voting before you leave
 - Mail-in absentee ballot
- Working/travelling out of country:
 - In-person voting before you leave
 - Overseas absentee ballot application

No Excuse Absentee Voting By Mail

• You no longer need a reason to vote by absentee ballot. Any eligible voter can apply for a mail-in absentee ballot and vote from home.

Early Voting

- Eligible voters can now cast their ballot starting 46 days before Election Day at designated early voting locations
- You now have the right to time off work to vote at any time during the 46-day voting period.

Registering at the polls on Election Day

• If you plan on registering at the polls on Election Day, you will need <u>proper identification</u>. There are several options.
