

Checklist

- I visited with an application assistant and together we performed safety planning.
- I reviewed the application instructions.
- I made sure that I completed the entire application.
- I signed and dated the application.
- I put my completed application and other required documents in the envelope provided by Safe at Home.
- I indicated a return address on the envelope.
- I put the required amount of postage on the envelope.

You applied to Safe at Home. What's Next?



YES



Make sure the entire application is completed. Do not leave fields blank. If you do, it may cause your application to be rejected.



Mail the application through the regular mail with correct postage.



Save the Safe at Home number
in your cell phone contacts.

Expect a telephone call from
Safe at Home 1-3 weeks after

Follow your safety plan.

If you have recently moved,
keep your new address
private.

Do not email your application to Safe at Home. It will be rejected.



Do not email Safe at Home.
Safe at Home will not
communicate with you
through email.



If you've recently relocated, do not give your address to anyone. Wait for your assigned Safe at Home address, if possible.



If you recently relocated, do not submit a change of address request with the post office.



Do not purchase a home or land until after you are enrolled in Safe at Home.

There are laws that help Safe at Home participants privatize ownership records, but the laws are not retroactive. Wait!

Relocation is key

If you did not relocate before you applied to Safe at Home, strongly consider moving after you are enrolled and have received your assigned Safe at Home address. Safe at Home is only an effective safety strategy for people who relocate either immediately before or shortly after enrollment. Maintaining a confidential address requires avoiding disclosure of your real address to any person, business, agency, or company. Safe at Home does not provide redaction services.
